

"Child Abuse Recognition and Reporting for Dental Professionals" 2 CE Credits

PDA's program, Child Abuse Recognition and Reporting for Dental Professionals, is approved by the Department of Human Services and the PA State Board of Dentistry and will fulfill Act 31 mandatory CE requirements for licensed dental professional (dentists, hygienists and EFDAs). "Street Drugs Exposed – What Your Patients and Your Kids ARE NOT Telling You!!" 6CE Credits
(MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER TO ATTEND – NO EXCEPTIONS)

What questions should I be asking my patients to avoid drug interactions with street drugs? What is the impact on my practice of the recent resolutions, approved by the American Dental Association, for providing dental care for patients who are and/or have been chemically dependent? What are some of the oral manifestations of street drug abuse? How will I know if a person is under the influence of street drugs? What are the characteristics of and how do I manage the "doctor shopper"? Do I have to take any precautions with the dental patient who is under the influence? Why is it so important that the dental staff be knowledgeable about street drugs? Why am I at risk? What are some characteristics of adolescent substance abuse and what do I do about it. The dental team is in a unique position providing dental care to the patient population that may be regular users or experimenting with mood altering drugs. This dynamic, brutally honest, and graphic presentation will take you from the streets and into the office to help you identify and manage the substance abusing patient. Discussion includes the origins, types, mechanisms of action, and signs and symptoms of commonly abused prescription and illicit drugs.

Learn: the signs and symptoms of commonly abused prescription and illicit drugs in patients and adolescents; the biochemical basis for the disease of addiction; what medications to avoid with the suspected drug abusing patient; how to recognize and manage the doctor shopper; how to manage the chemically-dependent patient; what are "meth mouth", "lean", "whippets", "parachuting", "bath salts", "Spice Diamond, Spice Gold" and more; why some people become addicted and others do not; how does my kid get intoxicated on hand sanitizer?

Harold L. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy, the Master of Science and Doctorate degrees in Pharmacology, and the DDS Degree. The liaison between the classroom and his part-time dental practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office. He has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974.

The Value of a Nonprofit is Priceless—Why the Medical Bureau Exists

We exist to serve a need in the community. The work you do costs money; sometimes a large amount. Patients aren't always in the position to pay for that care. The uninsured and underinsured deserve the best treatment plan you recommend and they deserve to pay for only those services.

The 9% service fee charged on every loan is not to benefit The Medical Bureau. It simply covers our operating expenses and allows us to continue to offer never-any-interest financing to your deserving patients. Think of it as a charitable donation towards an honest, reputable organization that has been helping people in the Southwestern PA area since 1937.

As a nonprofit, we don't operate in an effort to gain revenue for the benefit of the owner, directors, or shareholders. The main goal of a nonprofit is to generate funds and volunteer assistance to those in need. The only people who benefit are the patients who need the work and also you, the service provider. The more loans we approve, the more revenue we generate, and that 9% can go down. Our operating expenses won't change, but that fee will. We are run by our Board of Directors consisting of 8 physicians and dentists. Some are retired while others are still practicing. These are your peers. They know what it's like trying to juggle what's best for the patient against what the insurance will cover and what the patient can afford. They know that even if a root canal is best, the extraction is cheaper, so oftentimes people sacrifice a tooth to spare their wallets. That shouldn't have to happen. These board members have you in mind when they make every decision. They want to protect you and your patients. A loan from us means a guaranteed payment in full instead of receivables. It means you have contributed a fee allowing us to continue our mission.

We understand that other financing companies can offer a lower rate, and that seems enticing. Money talks. But they are only able to offer that rate at the expense of your trusting patients. They *must* make a profit, and depend upon patient default at predatory rates to insure that they do. So who really benefits? The big business. And who loses? The patient. We just don't think that's fair.

Please consider the Medical Bureau first when advising your patients about treatment financing.

Proposed Changes to DSWP Constitution and Bylaws

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE V OFFICERS

SECTION 1 - Elective Officers:

The elective officers shall be a President, President-Elect, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected as provided in Chapter II of these Bylaws and shall serve a term of one year except that the President may serve a term of two years. The Secretary and the Treasurer may serve no more than five consecutive one year terms. The elective officers of this Society shall serve as Directors.

BYLAWS

CHAPTER II ELECTION AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1 - Election of Officers:

The elective officers of this Society shall be elected during the Annual Business Meeting. Newly elected officers shall take office when installed in January of the year immediately following their election, and shall serve for one year to the end of their stated terms or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

Note: The proposed changes will be voted on during the Annual Meeting at the Rivers Dental Conference in Nemacolin.



MoM-n-PA Update

Congratulations to the members of the DSWP for a very successful MoM-n-PA event.

Leads were given information regarding the attendance, procedures, etc.

The 2016 Pittsburgh MoM-n-PA event provided \$841,959 of free dental care. This is quite comparable to the \$850,000 in Philadelphia in 2013; and \$875,905 in Harrisburg in 2015.

The Pittsburgh MoM-n-PA saw significantly less patients than other MoMs (\sim 900 vs \sim 1800 in Philadelphia and \sim 1700 in Harrisburg); however, we were able to provide the majority, if not all, of the dental treatments needed by patients. Despite having less patients, the amount of procedures completed were very similar to past MoMs.

All in all, it was a great success. Since the majority of DSWP members participated in MoM-n-PA, it's only appropriate to acknowledge the contribution of our members to this worthwhile cause.

Congratulations, everyone. Next year's MoM-n-PA will be at Erie, PA on June 16th and 17th.
